1. TFGON's Quarterly Networking Reception 23 OCT--- call for RSVP's: We're using this newsletter to transmit our 1st call for RSVP's for

TFGON's 2nd Tranche of additions to the TSA PreCheck airport security program for retired military Flag & General Officers: We sent our 1st list of applicants to this new TFGON program to TSA for approval over a month ago---- it was approved by TSA in less than a week and the program is now in place and well underway and working exceptionally well. Plus new applicants have been coming in at a brisk pace to the degree that we plan on sending our 2nd list to TSA for approval earlier than scheduled. As such, all those who applied for this program between 29 AUG and tomorrow, 30 SEPT, will be forwarded to TSA for approval on Thursday, 1 OCT and we will advise the membership via e-mail when this 2nd list has been approved by TSA. All new applicants beginning 1 OCT will be added to our 3rd list which will be planned for submission to TSA mid-NOV.

4. Stradley Ronon Corporate Directors and Officers Academy for Flag & General Officers on track for next week: 6-7 OCT in Washington, DC:

5. Retired DOD ID Card Replacement Information for those cards issued

2010 and prior: TFGON has been receiving a significant increase in the number of queries from our membership on this topic, so we've delved into it and are forwarding this info to you FYI and for your action if it applies to you. For TFGON members, this has special application, given we tied the Known Traveler Number required for our TSA PreCheck airport security program to this number on your retired DOD ID Card. Bottom line is that for those of you whose ID card was issued 2010 and before, we recommend that you take the time to get your card reissued, then if you are in TFGON's TSA PreCheck Program, just let us know via e-mail of your new ID card number and we'll get that changed with TSA so you can use it as your KTN.

This effort relates to having your Social Security Number on your retired DOD ID Card. Cards issued 2010 and before had your SSN on the face of that card. For security and privacy and "other issues", DOD decided to discontinue using your SSN on their ID Cards and thus retired DOD ID Cards issued 2011 and after show an "ID Card Identification Number" on the face of the ID Card where the SSN used to be. Note that the above URL's are dated and advise to replace your ID 30 days prior to it's expiration. Our TFGON members who have already replaced their old ID Cards advise us that you do NOT need to wait until within 30 days of the card expiring and the ID Card issuing facilities will replace these old ID Cards no matter when they expire.

There are more than 1,500 ID card centers worldwide. To find the nearest center, visit the RAPIDS site locator

at www.dmdc.osd.mil/rsl/owa/home Applicants must present two forms of identification and one must be an unexpired federal- or state-issued photo ID. You may get a msg saying this URL has expired, but just wait and the website will take you to the website page that you need to find the ID card issuance center nearest you.

6. DARPA Tech Forum earlier this month previewed National Security Future: The Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency's "Wait, What?" Future Technology Forum

wrapped up earlier this month with a remembrance of those who died on 9-11 and presentations covering the leading edges of everything from extraterrestrial life and cold molecules to lighting up the living brain. More than 1,400 scientists and engineers engaged on those and many other topics during the sold-out Sept 9-11 forum. DARPA Director Arati Prabhakar told the audience on the forum's first day that the ultimate goal of the forum---- in line with DARPA's mission---- "is to make the pivotal early investments in breakthrough technologies to create huge new possibilities for national security".
